


Between Heaven and Earth

Resource Evaluation

CURRICULUM FIT

Does the resource support BC curriculum?

This product supports the Core Competencies of the BC curriculum:

Between Heaven and Earth explores overcoming challenges, interdependence, friendship, and sensitivity to cultural differences. Therefore, it ties into the Health and Career outcomes. However, there are many moral and legal decisions made by characters that go unquestioned by the author. It is necessary for the teacher to engage students in critical thinking opportunities by presenting these dilemmas for discussion.

SUGGESTED CLASSROOM USAGE

The novel is suitable as a read aloud, Literature Circle selection, and/or class novel study. (Would encourage teacher direction/involvement)

SOCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Gender Roles, Identity & Sexual Orientation:

The novel identifies that some cultures reserve some roles for men only; the story features a teen who wants to be the first female porter to climb the mountain.

Indigenous Peoples:

Chagga are the local people and some of their beliefs and customs are depicted.

Multiculturalism:

Chagga, Finnish, English, Canadian and Australian characters climb the mountain together.

Ability:

People of all ages climb Mt. Kilimanjaro; even fit climbers suffer mountain sickness and get carried down.

Belief System:

There is a belief that spreading ashes at the top of a mountain brings the deceased's soul between heaven and earth. "It does not matter if it is right or wrong, this is what must be done." This quotation applies to a variety of situations throughout the book. Discussion should take place.

Socio Economic:

"Those boys who stole...did not do it out of greed, but out of need. It does not make it right, but...less wrong"

Violence:

The possibility of fighting is implied.

Ethical:

Ashes from cremation were smuggled illegally. The smuggling is detected but the boy escapes consequences because the judge is a family friend. A girl lies in order to climb the mountain as a porter and a boy supports the lie despite the risk to her safety.

Safety:

There are considerable safety risks: a 17 year old is on his own in foreign country; inexperienced climbers ignore cautions and climb to the summit without an expert guide; protagonists visit the thieves' market to buy back their stolen goods.

Language:

There is mention of 'crap'.

Do the social considerations support, rather than detract from, student learning? Moderately

Social Considerations Comments:

The protagonist does learn and grow along his journey; however, some of the choices made are morally and/or legally questionable. Teachers should be encouraged to lead rich discussions from issues such as keeping another's lie a secret despite risks to safety, going against expert

advice in order to meet personal goals, and smuggling and escaping consequences due to personal connections.

With teacher direction and guidance, "Between Heaven and Earth" could challenge students to delve into philosophical discussions and enrich their critical thinking skills. Without teacher input, students may get caught up in the plot and miss some of the ethical questions inherent in the story which are not highlighted by the author as moral dilemmas.

This novel includes a family tree and map at the beginning to help readers understand character relationships and location of events.

INSTRUCTIONAL DESIGN

Between Heaven and Earth is a novel that does not include an instructional guide or discussion questions.

Plot description:

His grandfather's will gives a 17 year old boy the task of climbing Mt. Kilimanjaro to spread his grandfather's ashes. The plot emphasizes the importance of focusing on giving one's best effort in the present. DJ learns the importance of humility, teamwork and friendship as he encounters challenges and questions his ability to suceed. Stereotypes are challenged by the successful climb of an elderly woman and a teen girl while fit young men succumb to mountain sickness.

Related Comments:

The novel is appropriate for upper intermediate/middle school learners interested in social responsibility issues, goal setting, challenging themselves and/or mountain climbing.
